#### Principal's Message

Week 3 and Term 3 is well under way. The Blue Light Cactus programme began this week with a motivated group of students and supporters working on personal fitness goals, with 6.00am starts in the gym three days a week and a whole lot of Police support.

The plan is at the end of the process, we will be a warmer, drier and more ecologically friendly school.

This is an important term especially for our NCEA students. The pressure is on to get assessments done, qualifications completed, applications for courses and accommodation, and, a whole lot more as seniors begin preparation for a life outside of school. The priority has to be preparation for your future in what can only get to be an increasingly competitive world, especially in the employment market. So, Senior students need to be preparing themselves well to get a foot into the real world.

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#### **Ugly Shakespeare**

Laughter, TikToks and jealousy erupted onstage at Putaruru College this morning as we hosted the famous Ugly Shakespeare Theatre Company. This year, for their 25th anniversary tour, they have been bringing to stages in schools across New Zealand a production of Shakespeare's Othello. The play follows the evil lago's scheming against the Venetian general Othello, who passed him over for promotion.

Ugly's style is modern and comical, focusing on the story of the play and bringing the themes alive through modern references. The three actors changed roles regularly, with props and costume such as Othello's beard, Cassio's red hat and cape, and Desdemona's blue dress and flower headpiece being key in signifying their characters. Playwright "Wiremu Shakespeare" appeared between scenes in a talk-show interview with "Eden DeGeneres" to explain the plot!

The production highlighted the thrill and energy in live theatre, and after the performance, students had the opportunity to engage in their own theatrical exploration through workshops. Around 30 students from all year levels were guided by the cast to develop their use of voice and movement to create characters. They then devised their own short scenes and presented these to their workshop group.

"It was cool to see actors doing properly the techniques you learn in drama class." - Arielle

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


