Learning for life

#### Principal's Message

Week 3 of Term 4 and the end of the year is approaching rapidly.

Lots of important things are happening over the next couple of weeks, things which will impact on the future learning of our students.

NCEA Students have just completed their final round of practice exams in preparation for the real thing beginning in less than three week's time.

Year 10 students will be undertaking examinations in their core subjects; English, Mathematics; Science and Social Studies, next week. The results of which will help to determine progress made and placements in some subject areas for 2021.

As well students in Years 10, 11 and 12 are to have a second round of subjects selections for 2021 over the next week. Original selections have been taken into account in determining which subjects will run and their place in the timetable structure.

Mrs Kersey has completed her interviews with Year 12 and 13 students with regards to future pathways and selection of subjects.

In week 6 we will be running a catch up programme for NCEA students who need a boost to get a few final credits to get them over the line for the attainment of their NCEA.

So, a busy time as time timetables are constructed; students prepare for external exams; classes and staffing is allocated for 2021. There will be also be two upcoming Teacher Only Days; one focussed on the proposed revisions of NCEA and the second focussed on understanding Te Tiriti o Waitangi and making it a more visible and natural part of our school. These will occur once the senior students

have gone on study leave and after the completion of the focus week for NCEA students.

At the Board of Trustees' meeting on Tuesday evening there was some discussion of issues around school uniform which led to the following resolutions being taken:

An alternative style skirt with logo is to be available

A sweat shirt / hoodie in black, with school logo to be investigated

With regards to Sports Team hoodies / Sweatshirts; these must be in school colours (black or maroon); they must bear the school logo and must be pre-approved by the Board before being worn in school as part of uniform (as are the Year 13 Leavers' Jerseys).

Cactus tops are specific to the period immediately after the completion of the Cactus programme and not accepted as general uniform item.

There is NO change to shorts or long trousers.

All items must be branded with the school logo.

Shoes can be black and white, but the predominant colour should be black (NO white laces) and socks are black NOT white or multi-coloured.

No items of old style uniform will be available for next year. All students will be expected to be completely in the new black and white uniform. Clothing items not branded with the school logo will be regarded as non-regulation and will be removed.

Now they just need to do the mahi to get the 6 credits.



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
## Bon Voyage—Putāruru College Cultural Tour to Te Waipounamu
