Principal's Message

Kia ora, talofa lava, namaste, kia orana.

On writing this, I am now entering my 10th day of being the Principal at Putāruru College. I have certainly experienced a mixture of emotions over the recent weeks, but the feeling of being fortunate and blessed to be in this role is certainly the overwhelming feeling.

Meeting the students has been an absolute highlight. I have told the students to come up and say hi - and they sure have! I have thoroughly enjoyed popping into classes, seeing learning in action, as well as talking with students at break times. What a neat 400 strong group of students we have here at Putāruru College. McKenzie Purdy delivered me the most beautiful Mac and Cheese to sample last week, it was incredible. There is a group of boys, led by Caleb White, canvassing me for an area of the school to scooter and they are wanting a skatepark built - I love their enthusiasm and we will talk more! It was great getting out to see the Girls Rugby team play last week - it reminded me of my own rugby playing days. I didn't know many people on the sideline, so I am hoping some of you will come over and introduce yourselves next time you see me sifting on the fringes of a sports game, or nipping into grab a coffee in town.

Over the past week or so I have been meeting 1 on 1 with staff to find out more about their roles, how they come to be at Putāruru College, what is working well here and what changes they would like to see. There is a real sense of warmth and respect across the staff. Russell Bishop in his book, Teaching to the North-East, describes this as "creating an extended family-like context for learning". Our next steps are to focus on interacting with students in ways that promote student learning, and to monitor progress more closely. We have started to look at the last 5 years of NCEA data, and will be reflecting on where we can make improvements.

Our Board of Trustees meeting is coming up on Monday 21st June 5.45pm, my first meeting - I am looking forward to working closely with our BOT. The following week, on Monday 28th June at 7pm, we have the whānau rōpū meeting and I am hoping to connect with whānau to talk more about how we can better support Māori learners.

Next week a number of our senior students will be doing practice exams. I strongly encourage students to take this opportunity seriously as it will provide such good information to students and teachers about what students need help with and where to focus their mahi. We are halfway through the academic year for seniors, so it's crucial they are tracking their credits and are on track to achieve NCEA. As a guideline, students should have 30-40 credits at this stage of the year. We will be talking to students more about this at school.
