**Tokoroa Bus Students**

There has been some poor behaviour from some of our students while waiting for the bus to Tokoroa (outside Countdown and around town). We have had complaints from the public. If we receive confirmation of who is causing the disturbance of vaping, swearing, PDA, and behaving inappropriately - school will not be funding bus tickets for those students. At the moment we are paying 50% of the bus fare. We won't continue doing this for students who aren't behaving respectfully while using this service. A reminder that at the start of next term students will be issued with a bus card, loaded with enough credit to get them through until the end of the year. It is important they use the card to swipe on and off the bus. Cards can be collected from student services - more information to come.

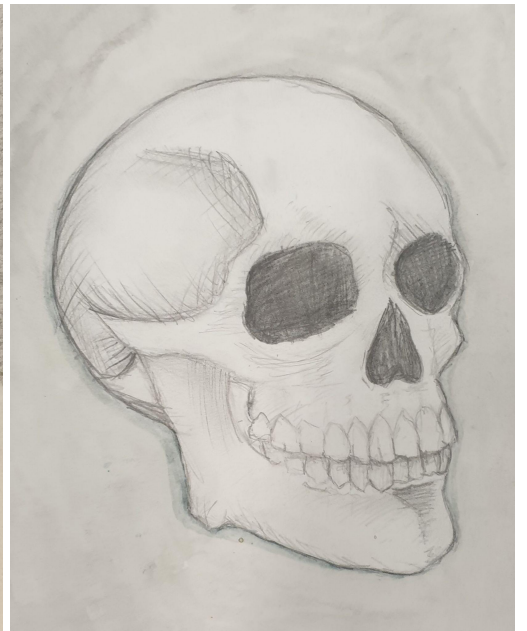
