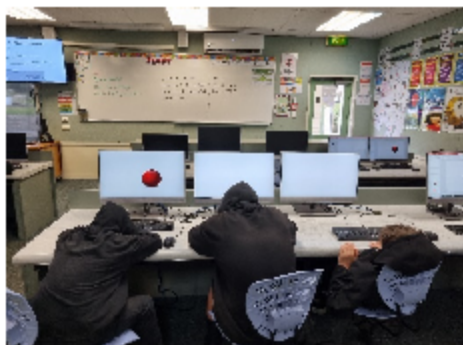

Today the Year 8 Digital Technology class accepted the Red Ball Challenge. Recently we have been learning MS PowerPoint and how to create fabulous presentations. The challenge at the end of the topic was to work in a group to animate a ball on 25 slides to look as if it was moving between monitors from left to right and then back again from right to left in a smooth animation. Surprisingly this involves a lot of maths as students need to work out how many blank slides they need before, between and after their ball slides so that they get the right timing. 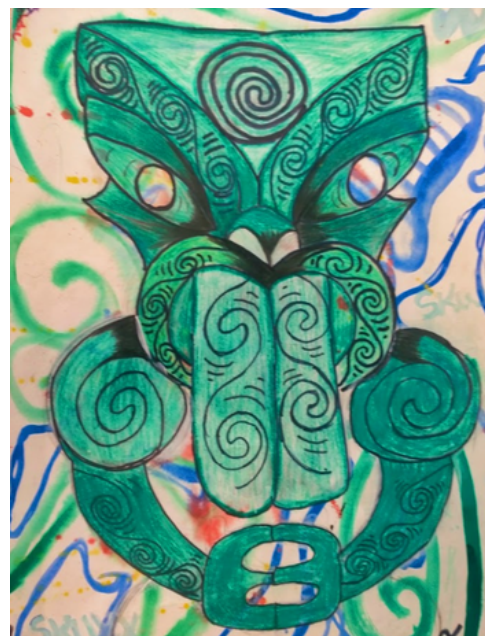

Journeying out of education

Today we hosted a Ministry of Education Transition Roadshow for our area to support the journey from school to adult life for students with disabilities and/ or support in place for their mental health. Better Lives Legal, a lawyer who specialise in Disability Law and advocacy.

Career Moves who support students to transition into employment and break down barriers to achieving their dreams.

Kiwi Staff, a locally owned recruitment agency with a social support arm.

Interactionz, a goal-setting social support group who customise their work to suit your needs.

Te Wananga o Aotearoa and **Toi Ohomai** talked about their accessibility services and flexibility to support student needs.

NZMA, whose goal is to help every student move ahead and break down barriers.
