

Celebrating Identity and Values Through Art: Unveiling the New Mural at Our School

We are excited to share the journey behind the creation of the striking mural that now graces the rear of our hall building. This captivating piece of art begins with a bold graphic interpretation of the Poutama design, employing a traditional color scheme. The intention behind this artistic endeavor was to craft a visually impactful image with architecturally enhancing lines, ensuring its visibility all the way to the field.

In consultation with our cultural leader, Tiniwaata Hill, a pattern and color scheme were carefully selected, drawing from the rich well of Mātauranga Māori. Looking ahead, the mural's development will involve collaboration with our students through a co-construction process. The plan is to create cut-outs in stages that can be crafted indoors and affixed to the mural. The hope is to engage students of all ages in this creative process, with the objective of visually communicating our school's values and perhaps celebrating Pūtaruru's rich history and unique identity. Students are encouraged to reflect on their individual identity, goals, dreams, and aspirations as they contribute to this collective masterpiece.

A critical aspect of the mural is its carefully chosen colour scheme. Black (Pango) represents Te Korekore, the realm of potential being, from where all things emerge. White (Ma) symbolizes Te Ao Mārama, the living world, connecting force and light. Red (Whero/Kōkōwai) embodies Te Whei Ao, the realm of coming into being, signifying the red clay of the earth and blood. Together, these colours symbolise unity between the world of spirits, people, and nature.

As this mural takes its place as a vibrant addition to our school's landscape, let it serve as a testament to the diversity that unites us, and the aspirations that drive us forward. Together, we celebrate our collective identity and the unique tapestry that makes our school a community.

### **Movers and shakers!**

Selected Senior Year 12 and 13 students learned the fundamentals of bar tending and regulations in the hospitality industry this week.

External provider, ITS, offered a two-day course during which students learned how to prepare cocktails and how to be a responsible host in a hospitality setting, like judging levels of intoxication and knowing when and how to steer people towards some water and an Uber home!
