Hello there! I'm delighted to have the opportunity to introduce myself to you all. My name is Lynn Hawkes, and I've been teaching Food and Nutrition/ Hospitality here at Putāruru College since 2010. What's even more special is that not only have I had the pleasure of teaching generations of students from this wonderful community, but my own children and grandchildren have also attended.

Living in this community for over 25 years has allowed me to truly become a part of it, and I can't express how much joy it brings me to teach something I'm truly passionate about. Food isn't just a subject to me; it's a way of life. Working with the incredible students here at our school is an absolute privilege, and I'm thrilled to be a part of this vibrant learning community.

Junior classes, from year 7-10, undertake foundation courses which instil basic cookery skills and nutrition knowledge. These foundation courses give students the knowledge they require to further embed skills at a higher level if they continue into senior level.

Senior classes are doing a range of Hospitality Standards at level one and two. This year we are also working with Mrs Duthie, and Kura Kai, to assist with providing food to our community.







Digital Technology





Dia duit, is é mo ainm Teresa Walker. I am the Teacher in Charge of Digital Technology at Putaruru College. I have been teaching Digital Technology in this wonderful place since 2020 and Digital Technology in general for a very long time. I have lived in the South Walkato since I was a teenager and now, I am married with two wonderful children. Digital Technology is an exciting area to learn and teach in as it amazing how quickly new technology comes out faster and smaller. There is always something new and exciting happening or being developed.

In the Digital Technology subjects at Putaruru College students learn a range of different skills. The Year 8 rotation has just finished up with a mBot Maze Challenge competition where they needed to program their mBots, which are little car robots, to run a maze with lights, sound and a display without touching the lines or going off the maze. Congratulations to Jett Thompson and Zion Temarama who won the competition. Special shout-out goes to Tom Shaw for the Best Music and Zoe Galbraith for Best Dance. Year 9's are learning basic formatting and skills in MS Word before they move onto graphics in our 3D design and printing topic. In Year 11, the first of the new curriculum standards is well under way, students are learning to create a computer program using Python. Year 12 has just started on their MS Excel standard and Year 13's are learning design concepts behind creating eBooks. There is always plenty going on and I would love to have a chat to you regarding your students' progress.

Year 8 Student Reflection

In Digital Technology this term we have done a range of different activities. Our focus this week has been on coding our mBots to do a range of different things. For example, we have coded our mBots to play a happy birthday song, using different notes and beats. We have also coded our mBots to go around a maze without touching the black lines while they have sound, matrix, and lights. In DTC we have experimented with 3D printing our nametags, bookmarks, and emoji keyrings. We have also learnt how to type with speed as well as our fingers being on the home keys. Digital Technology has been great this term and I have really enjoyed it.
