


#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

# **Digital Technology**

# What's been happening this term?

The Digital Technology Department has been a hive of activity so far this year!! It is always so busy with students learning with and about digital technology. In Computer Lab 1, the wonderful Mr Rogers and Lyn La'aiva were able to secure funding to replace the old Chromeboxes with a suite of 30 brand new ones with 24" screens. The old Data Projector has been replaced with a 50" TV screen. The room has now been transformed into an up-to-date learning space for students. Last year we gained a 80" promethean screen for Computer Lab 1, this is an interactive screen where we can demonstrate skills and students can easily follow from their computers. It has made an impressive difference to being able to teach showing students where/how they are able to use programs.






**Year 8 students** have spent this week learning programming skills. They have worked in pairs to program mBots, which look like little cars. Each mBot is capable of being programmed with sound, lights and a 8x16 matrix at the front. Students final test is to see if they can get their mBot to move through a maze on the floor without touching the black lines or going off the plastic. Thoughout the trip their





mBot must play a tune, light up and display something on the matrix. It is always a fun lesson watching students put their learning to the test and frustrating for some when their mBot doesn't do what they want it to and turns the wrong way or goes for miles!

Typing practice is an important skill for all students to learn. Most class work and assessments in Secondary School are now digital and assessments can be timed. Each lesson from **Year 7 – 13 all students** are expected to start off with some typing practice as our Do Now. Being able to type quickly and efficiently gives students' a massive advantage when completing their work in all of their subjects. However, this doesn't mean that typing practice has to be boring. We have come a long way from 'dictation' typing practice and now there are many websites that have fun learning to type tutorials. The main typing site we use is Typing Club where students learn the keyboard and where the keys are, hoping that they will learn to touch type. One challenge that student's love is typing the alphabet in 5 seconds or less! This is one challenge that students love or hate but all love and get slightly obsessed with, the quickest student has been 3.4 seconds. One of my Yr 8 students Lily S has managed to type correctly the first 15 numbers of Pi in 2.61 seconds, that's at a speed of 77 words per minute!!



**Year 9 students** have just finished up their 3D printing unit and have created some awesome projects. The Digital Technology Department is lucky enough to have three 3D printers. Students are able to learn basic 3D design using TinkerCad and learn about how to create projects from scratch.

Some projects don't go quite to plan as some forget to check that their projects don't have parts floating in mid-air or parts that are not connected to their project, but it is all a learning curve and students love being able to print their projects are see the end results. We have recently changed our preferred filament supplier to KiwiFil in Tokoroa, this is to support local businesses and KiwiFil have a great recycling ethos that is an awesome example to students regarding thinking about the waste that gets produced and put into landfills.





Year 10 students are currently working on a Biography project where they research the life of ICT



people that have had an impact on technology in some way. They are surprised by the number of unknown names to them, there are more than just Mark Zuckerburg, Elon Musk and Bill Gates!! Once students have researched the life of the person they are given, they format their findings into a template which they will make into a project to display in the classroom.

**Year 11 – 13 students** are well into their year of study. It has been pleasing to note the focused and mature attitude this year's students have bought to their studies. The standards we focus on are based on learning the Microsoft Office suite, Word, Excel, Publisher, PowerPoint. This is because MS Office is industry standard, and students benefit from these skills no matter what subject they take at school or future endeavours once they graduate. From being able to navigate a word processing program, understand spreadsheet data and graphs or being able to create a presentation, students understanding, and knowledge is a valuable tool for their future.


