#### Jordan and Lleyton are coming home with gold and silver!

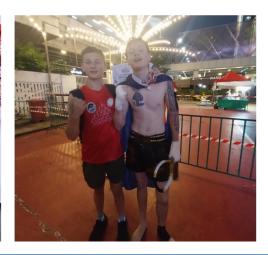
A huge congratulations to Lleyton, who has brought home gold after an incredible victory against England in the Under 17 Muay Thai World Championships!

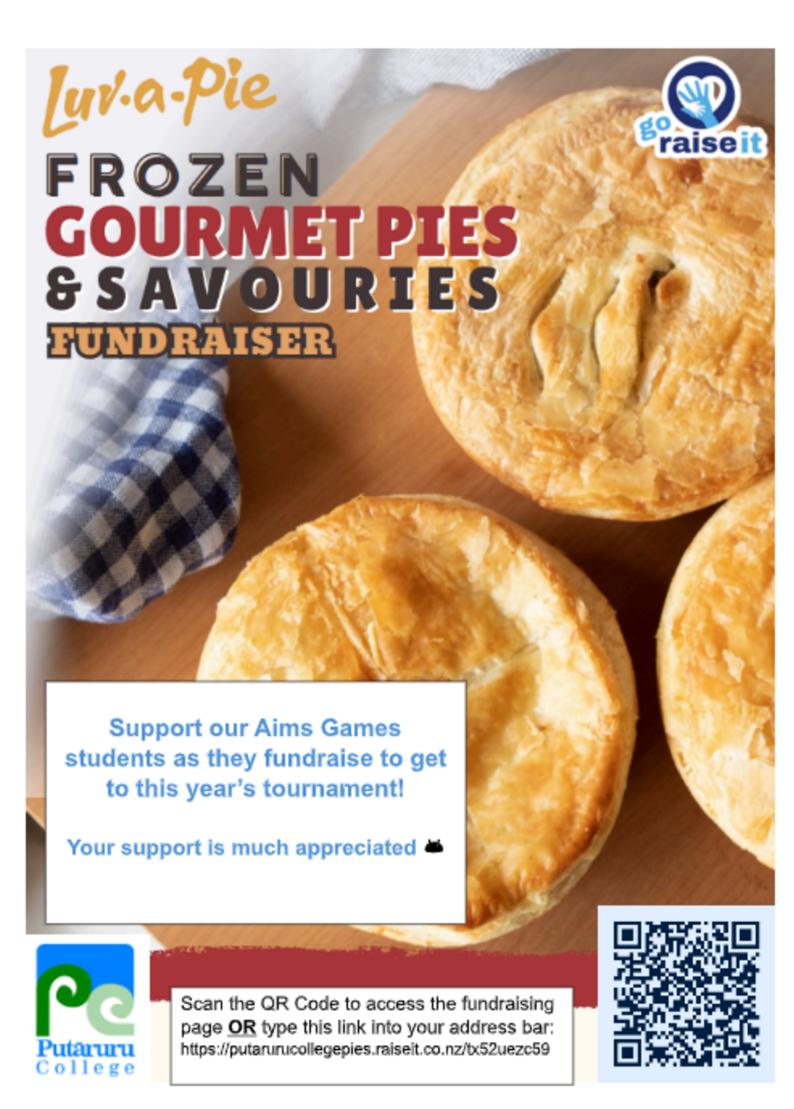
